Minutes

- Greetings and Introductions

The meeting was held in person and on Zoom for parents to attend virtually. Ms. Hunt, the principal, introduced herself and the staff to the Parents and Guardians present in the meeting. She explained each teacher or staff member's role in the school.

- Title 1 Annual Parent Meeting Presentation

Ms. Hunt explained what Title 1 is and how it is used within our school to support reading and math. Explanation of how students' needs were determined based on teacher recommendation, test scores, and progress monitoring with various online tests including Reading Plus and FAST state tests. Ms. Hunt explained what would be done in reading classes, pullouts, and intensive math to help with test scores and fundamentals.

- Title 1 Budgets and What They are Used For

Ms. Hunt explained how the budget was determined and how it is very rare for high schools to receive funding for Title 1. She explained the different programs and introduced the Title 1 teachers and their role in the classrooms and support for all teachers in the areas of reading and math.

- Question and Answer Session

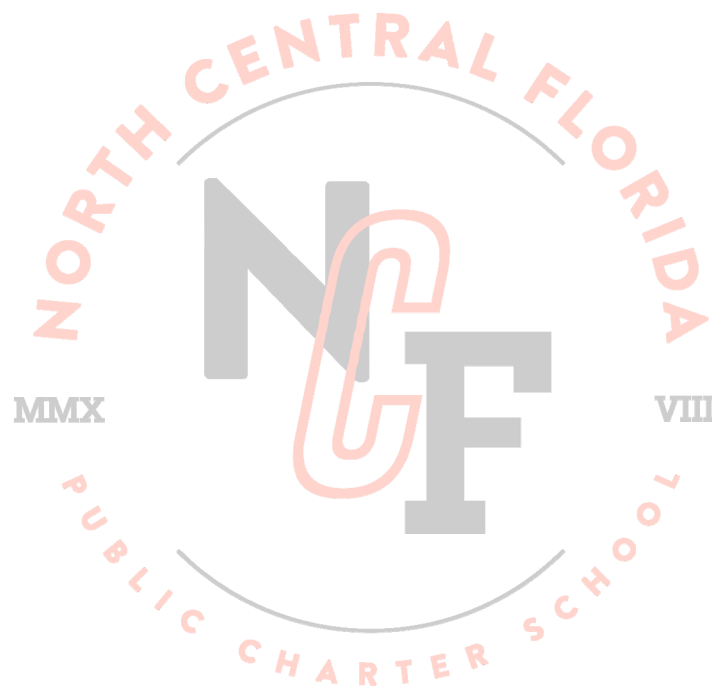
Parents were given opportunities to ask questions about how the student was pulled out of classes or how push-in works. Students and Parents were also told that they could receive information on progress at any time.

- Evaluations

Testing for the various grades was explained. The new FAST test was explained and the DOE website given if parents had more questions or wanted to see how



the students would be assessed throughout the year. ACT information was given to parents as the test for 11th and 12th graders and the dates the test would be administered. All parents were given the opportunity to speak with Ms. Law, Ms. Smith, Mr. Harsh, or Ms. Hunt about the tests needed for graduation and where students were with the credits necessary for graduation. Parents and students were released to the classrooms to talk with individual teachers about progress in class and any concerns parents may have had.



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
